Do you know how much water you have stored on farm? Do you know how much you should have, and how to get it where you need it? Corowa District Landcare, together with West Hume Landcare, are hosting a series of Farm Water Management Planning workshops.



With our expert trainer, Peter Smith from Sapphire Irrigation, will lead these ½ day workshops. These workshops will assist you with developing a comprehensive Farm Water Management Plan for your enterprise. The plan will cover available water storage, water supply assessment and estimating livestock and farm activity demand.

What's been happening?

Seed Collection Workshop (Wednesday 13th December)

Even though it was a bit on the warmer side, we had a great morning learning about seed collection from Natasha Lappin. Tash is a Senior Land Service Officer - Murray Seed Services, Murray Local Land Services based in Corowa. The workshop was held at Lowesdale Rest Area (Riverina Hwy, Coreen) and the seed production areas (within the TSR) across the road.

We had a practical introduction to collecting seed from common native plants, from the basics of collecting, drying and processing a range of different types of seed, which tools to use, where to collect from, and outlines when permits are required. More information on seed collection is available from Florabank guidelines

This workshop was the first part of our community nursery project. The community nursery is where members of the community grow their own native plants, either to plant in their own garden or give away to farmers. Friends of River Street Wetlands

The River Street Wetland Restoration Project is being undertaken by Corowa District Landcare. Project activities have involved the facilitation of volunteer maintenance group, riparian revegetation using local native species, and weed control to prepare for riparian vegetation or natural regeneration.

A "Friends of River Street Wetlands" group has been formed. This groups meets at the wetlands (66 Federation Ave, Corowa) on the 2nd Sunday of each month from 2 to 4 pm. Equipment has been purchased for the team of volunteers to use at the site. The main tasks that have been completed are weeding, rubbish removal, planting, mulching and watering. To date, over 600 volunteer hours have gone into the site.

Private Land Conservation Update - Biodiversity Conservation Trust Fixed Rate Offers Increased

Anyone that is contemplating their options for Biodiversity agreements on existing bush or other native vegetation blocks should be aware that in line with the change in land values, the Biodiversity Conservation Trust (BCT) fixed rates for conservation covenant agreements have increased substantially in the last review.

BCT has a range of agreement types – all involve in-perpetuity agreements with varying levels of management changes required. To find out more and see if your area is eligible for the fixed rate offer and what it is, go to CLICK HERE

There will be also tenders coming up in the next couple of years also – that is where there is a call for farmers to 'offer up' areas for specific conservation outcomes (eg. Grassy Woodlands). This allows landholders to set their own price for conservation, although not all projects may be successful.

The BCT also offers stewardship agreements that are tied to biodiversity credits needed to offset developments. There is currently a shortage of credits and the NSW government has created a taskforce to target this issue. They have a mapping tool that helps you work out if what you have is in demand CLICK HERE

These are environmental market opportunities that are available right now, and if you are considering that option for your business, they are worth looking in to. As they are 'forever' agreements you should get legal and business advice about how to manage it, but they are also 'forever' funding streams for your farm business.

Alternative income streams like this will become more and more common – for Carbon and other environmental services and we are already seeing them listed as assets on property advertising.
